Name of project: Emergency Flood Response Project

Location: Sunamgonj, Mymenshing Area, Bangladesh Period of project: July to October, 2022

Project description and progress: Bangladesh is prone to natural flooding. In recent years the regularity of extreme flood has increased causing severe damage to live and livelihood. Monsoon floods create disaster faster than any other time.

North-eastern Bangladesh is experiencing the worst flooding in 122 years. Approximately, 80 percent of Sylhet district and around 90 percent of Sunamganj district has been submerged, according to the Flood Forecasting and Warning Centre (FFWC). Over 4 million women, children and men have been severely impacted as a result of the floods. There is power shortage in most of the affected areas, the telephone network has collapsed, roads are critically damaged, and over 1,000 hectares of cropland have been damaged. More than 83 people have died in floods, said a report of the country's Health Emergency Operation Center and Control Room under the Directorate General of Health Services. The exact floods affected numbers are yet to figure out.

Due to continuous monsoon rainfall in India's Meghalaya district and Assam region since 15 May 2022, where record-breaking rainfall was recorded, consequently, the surge of upstream hilly waters flooded the low-lying areas of the north-eastern part of the country.

The impacts of the floods have been severely affected over 70 Adventist village Schools in Bangladesh. Over 2,000 children's education is uncertain because many schools have been submerged by the flood. These schools now require proper rehabilitation and infrastructure development for operating school programs again. The poor families have lost their belongings and living inside the flood water. Women suffer from lack of sanitation and personal hygiene. Children go hungry. Poor hygienic situation increases risk of disease outbreak. Markets are not operating properly, as a result, commodity price raised up not only there but also impacted across the country.

Did you encounter particular problems with the project?

Huge need for food supplies and they fight to get the emergency support. They need more support to survive in life.

Who will benefit from the project and how will the local community benefit?

There is an urgent need for 190 packages of food supplies (including dry food), safe drinking water, health care support, to the 170 flood-affected families surrounded community by the Adventist schools.
